Communication & Language (C&L)

- We will learn to be confident in asking and answering how and why questions about stories and events.
- Our speech will continue to improve including using different past, present and future tenses.
- We will develop our skills in working with others and responding to what they say.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

- We will become confident in playing with others and taking turns with equipment and when playing games.
- Through role-play and stories we will learn to show sensitivity to other people's needs and feelings.
- Throughout all of the topic we will be confident to speak in familiar groups and talk about our own ideas about the jungle and it's animals.

Physical development (PD)

- We will be confident in using a range of ways to overcome the jungle obstacle course.
- We will be confident in writing most letters correctly.
- We will be able to use a range of tools including scissors safely and correctly.
- We will show understanding of how to keep healthy and why it is important for use and jungle explorers.

<u>Literacy (L)</u>

- We will read and understand simple sentences during guided and independent reading sessions.
- We will be developing the use of diagraphs when reading words i.e. ai in rain and oa in goat.
- We become confident in reading and writing some common exception words (see home-school link books for information)
- We will write simple sentences about the jungle by ourselves.
- We will learn to be confident in reading our own work to an adult and peers.

Understanding of the World (UW)

- We will identify differences and similarities between habitats and jungle animals.
- We will make observations of animals.
- We will explore using a range of different technology including Beebots, microphones and interactive white boards.
- We will identify people who live in the jungle and compare our lives to their lives including similarities and differentiates.

Mathematics (M)

- We will learn to confidently identify one more and one less than a number than a given number to 20.
- We will practise adding and subtracting single numbers using objects.
- We will begin to explore sharing and doubling.
- We will explore weight, capacity, position and distance of objects, including using the correct language to talk about these in practical activities.
- We will identify and develop patterns on jungle animals.

Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

- We will develop our own jungle dances and respond to different music and sounds we hear.
- We will be confident in using a range of different colour, textures and techniques independently, including making a habitat.
- We will begin to design a jungle animals using our own ideas and thoughts.
- We will be confident in becoming jungle explorers and use a range of props to work with our peers to develop a jungle story line.
