

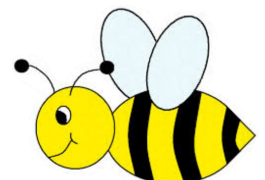

Bees live in a hive.

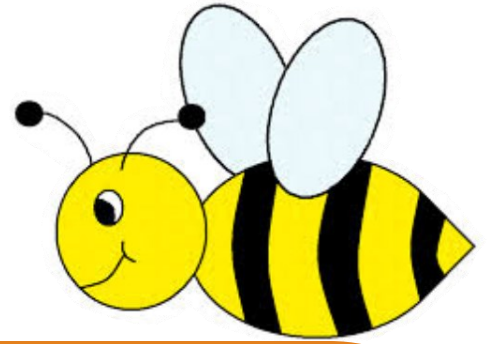


Bee Fact Cards
