

Maths Wellbeing	Counting back Place up to 10 objects in a straight line, ask your child to count from 1 up to 10, make sure they touch each object. When they have counted forwards accurately ask them to count from 10 back down to 1. Add more objects up to 15, encourage your child to count forwards first and then backwards touching each object whilst they count. Have a look at the globe or a map of the world, see if you can find where the continent of Africa is.	Counting back I count, you count is a game we played before. It can be used to practise counting back from different starting points. Have a collection of up to 15 objects. Counting back I want you to use the Jack and the Beanstalk activity to practice counting back. I would like your grown-up to mix up the beanstalks for you. Pick up a beanstalk and see what leaf jack is standing on, the instruction at the top tells you what Jack needs to do. Can you use words to describe what Jack is doing, e,g, First Jack is on leaf 5. Then he moves down 2 leaves. Now he is on leaf 3. Have a look at the globe or a map of the world, see if you can find where the continent of Africa is.

Counting Down the Beanstalk Subtraction Activity


Challenge children to use vocabulary involved with subtracting to help Jack climb down the beanstalk and reach the ground.


You will need:

Counting Down the Beanstalk Subtraction Cards

Activity

Explain that Jack is climbing down the beanstalk to escape the giant. Jack is on a numbered leaf on the beanstalk and a number is shown in a cloud to show how many leaves he is going to climb down. Challenge children to use vocabulary involved in subtracting to solve the subtraction questions and find the card where the answer is zero and Jack reaches the ground to escape the giant!
