Over the course of the week we would like you to attempt to read the Year 1 common exception words. The entire list is on a page below but we only want you to read as many as you can at a time. This is your challenge for the week so there is no need to read all of them today.</p> <p>Please could you tick the words that your child can read independently and without sounding them out. These words should be recognised quickly as whole words and with no prompting. Please do not worry if your child does not know all of them yet. This will give you a list of words that they do not know for you to work on. If your child knows all of these words, you can try the Year 2 words.</p> <p>We would also like children to continue with their reading. Your class teacher can let you know which book band colour to find on Oxford Owl for your child's current level as well as advice on how to help them progress.</p> <p>Spellings are on Spelling Shed.</p>	
Other	<p>Today's subject is Computing</p> <p>In Computing we use algorithms (a fancy word for instructions).</p> <p>Can you create a pirate scavenger hunt by drawing pictures of what you would like somebody in your house to find?</p> <p>Then give clear verbal instructions for how they can find those items. For example, take 10 steps forward, turn right (or, turn to face the kitchen if right and left are not known), take 5 steps forward, turn right, take 3 steps forward, open the cupboard door in front of you, take out a cup.</p> <p>Your family member will do exactly as you say so make sure your instructions are clear and accurate! You may need to 'debug' which means to correct your instructions if they do not work. Have fun!</p>

Items you could use for your pirate scavenger hunt



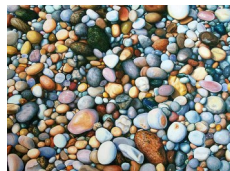
A pirate bandana (tea towel)
