PLURALS FACT SHEET

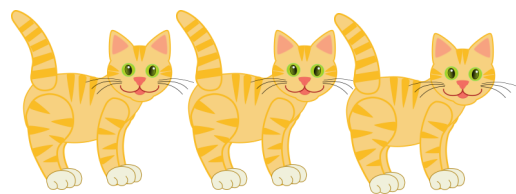
Singular means 'one'.

Plural means 'more than one'.

For most words we just add 's' to the end of it to change it into a plural.



cat



cats

If the word ends with one of these sounds then add 'es'.

ch

sh

ss

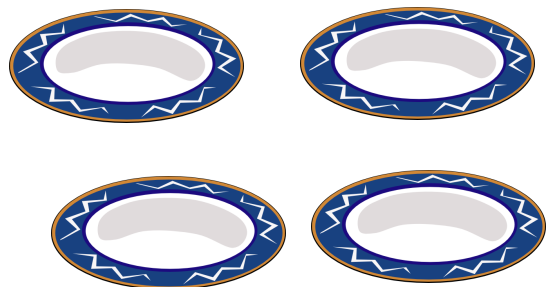

Other ways to help us know whether to add 's' or 'es'

If the ending sounds like /s/ or /z/, it is spelt as -s e.g. cats.

If the ending sounds like /iz/ and forms an extra syllable or 'beat' in the word, it is spelt as -es e.g. catches.
