The Great Fire of London

- 10 On Sunday 2nd September 1666, a fire began in a
- 19 bakery on Pudding Lane in London. The baker had
- 30 forgotten to put out the fire he had used to bake
- 39 his bread. The fire soon spread to other buildings.
- 48 In 1666, buildings in London were made of wood
- 57 and built very close together, which meant the fire
- 65 could spread easily. There were no firefighters so
- 75 people had to try to put the fire out themselves,
- 83 using buckets of water from the River Thames.
- 91 The fire carried on spreading on Monday and
- 97 Tuesday. Luckily, on Wednesday, the wind
- 105 stopped and the fire was finally put out.
- 114 The fire destroyed large parts of London, which had
- 117 to be rebuilt.
