
# **Skill vocabulary:**

## Line


Definition – A line is the path left by a moving point e.g. a pencil or a brush dipped in paint. A line can take many forms e.g. horizontal, diagonal or curved. A line can be used to show feelings and expressions.












# Texture

Definition – The way something looks and feels. This can be split into actual texture (what can be felt) and visual texture (what can be seen).





#### Tone


Definition – Tone means the lightness or darkness of something. This could be how light or dark something appears. Tones are created by the way light falls on a 3D object.


















A tone which is uncomfortable on the eyes or difficult to view.

#### Pattern

Definition – A pattern is a design that is created by repeating lines, shapes, tones or colours. Patterns can be manmade or natural.







#### Shape and Form

Definition – A shape is an area enclosed by a line. It could be just an outline or it could be shaded in. Form is a three dimensional shape. Sculpture is about creating forms.

2D shapes
Having only two dimensions, such as width and height but no thickness. Squares, Circles, Triangles, etc are two-dimensional objects.

3D shapes A 3D shape has three dimensions. It is any shape or object that takes up air space. Sphere, Cube, Cylinder, Pyramid, Cone.

Flat
A flat shape is a
shape with only 2
dimensions (2D).

Curved
A curved
line can be geometric, like the
arc of a perfect
circle.


Regular shapes have sides that are all equal and interior (inside) angles that are all equal.




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# Shape and Form

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Coiled To wind into rings or spirals.

#### Symmetrical

Something is symmetrical when it is the same on
both sides. A shape
has symmetry if a Central
dividing line (a mirror line)
Can be drawn on it, to show
that both sides of the shape
are exactly the same.

#### Twisted

A Convention of representation in which part of a figure is shown in profile and another part of the same figure is shown frontally.

#### Rounded

A round shape Consisting of a Curved line that Completely encloses a space and is the same distance from the Centre at every point.

#### Proportioned


In experiencing the scale of an artwork we tend to Compare its size to the size of our own bodies. Proportion refers to the relative size of parts of a whole (elements within an object).

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Angular
Forming an angle:
sharp-cornered,
having one or
more angles.

Bulbous Bulb-shaped, bulging. Asymmetrical Not identical on both sides of a Central line; unsymmetrical, lacking symmetry.

Forked Zigzag, as lightning. Geometric Resembling the simple rectilinear or curvilinear lines or figures.

# Irregular

A polygon that does not have all sides equal and all angles equal. (A polygon is "regular" only when all angles are equal and all sides are equal, otherwise it is irregular.)

Tapering
Becoming thinner or narrower
towards one
end.

Sweeping Having a curving line or form. Curvaceous Having a smoothly curving shape, eg; a Curvaceous coas tline.

#### Elongated

"Elongated art" refers to paintings that feature figures that are painted with their forms elongated much more than they are in realty. Elongation is a form of abstract art that often depicts the stretched forms of people or objects in hature.
