# **Knypersley First School 2023-2024**

### What is the PE and Sports Premium Funding?

The government is providing funding of over £450 million per annum for academic years 2013-2020 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

#### Purpose of funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving provision of PE and sport but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium: ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the **knowledge**, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a **healthy**, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport

The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following **OBJECTIVE:** To achieve <u>self-sustaining</u> <u>improvement</u> in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

#### It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

Key Indicator 1: the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school Key Indicator 2: the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement Key Indicator 3: increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport Key Indicator 4: broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils Key Indicator 5: increased participation in competitive sport

Here at Knypersley First School we value the difference physical education and sport can have on children's lives and we work hard to embrace all the opportunities we can to give pupils access to as many sporting experiences as possible. In addition to this we advocate and use the outdoor environment as much as possible to add value to the curriculum our pupils receive.

#### Evaluation of plan/ Feed forward information for next year:

During the last academic year a major focus has been to upskill our new ECTs and ensure they are confident to plan and deliver high quality PE lessons. This has been achieved as a result of a rigorous support package which has covered the 3 mains areas of PE; gymnastics, dance and games. Lessons observations of the new to school staff has taken place and has shown impact of the training. Support with planning has also been a particular area with the new ECTs through the use of PEDPASS and GetSet4PE.

Another area of development this year has been within the school swimming pool. During the Christmas holidays the swimming pool was resealed which has ensured the high quality swimming lessons have continued without disruption resulting in children's progress increasing. There has also been a focus around active lunchtimes. Children have been trained as playground leaders to deliver active and inclusive activities during lunch. During the year the lunchtime activity offer has differed which now offers free choice for all children on both playgrounds. Pupil voice has shown children enjoy this system. The sports premium funding has also provided increased opportunities for all Early Years children where gross motor skills have improved.

Next year the links between local and professional organisations will be of importance to increase opportunities for all children in particular those who are on the pupil premium and SEND register. Another of our focuses next year will be to induct the new PE lead with a supportive package and training such as leading PE with the Accelerated Learning company.
